The Range of Tools

- Converters
 - Save as features or standalone conversion programs
- Editors
 - Designed to help hard code
- Generators (WYSIWYG – What you see is What you get – authoring tools)
 - Powerful, expensive and often limiting

WYSIWYG Authoring Tools

- Advantages
 - Good for beginners (except the fact that they often prohibit the learning of code)
 - Good for quick prototypes
 - Good way to start monotonous things (like tables)
 - Generally a time saver
- Disadvantages
 - Many do not generate clean code (trash tags, deprecated or obsolete tags)
 - Many change any “custom code” you write
 - Many do not conform to latest standards
 - Most do not provide graphic control (or support of multimedia elements)
 - Most powerful packages are expensive

The primary thing to keep in mind about any Integrated Development Environment (IDE), multimedia or hypermedia authoring tool is this:

- Learn the tool, and you can do only what the tool can do. Learn the language and you can do anything.
- Do not become tool dependent – know how the technology works and you will get to the point that you will be able “to see into the future” as it were...
